Primary ELA (Grades K-2)

June 20-23, 9am-12pm, \$400

July 25-28, 9am-12pm, \$400

Students will explore reading and writing with a variety of fun activities for emerging readers and writers. This seminar focuses on phonics, sight words, reading skills, comprehension, and elementary writing.

Primary Math (Grades K-2)

June 20-23, 1pm-4pm, \$400

July 25-28, 1pm-4pm, \$400

Students will engage in a variety of elementary math activities using hands-on manipulatives. Students will work on basic math operations, helping to reinforce the memorization of their math facts, telling time, and adding and subtracting with decimals, including currency.

Elementary ELA (Grades 3-5)

June 27-30, 9am-12pm, \$400

August 1-4, 9am-12pm, \$400

Students will strengthen reading, comprehension, writing and grammar skills. They will reinforce their understanding of how to recognize literary devices, main ideas, themes, supporting details, and genres. Note: if combined with the afternoon math class for this age group, parents can opt for the student to stay with us, for an additional nominal charge for the week. We will have pizza and snowballs during the break!

Elementary Math (Grades 3-5)

June 27-30, 1pm-4pm, \$400

August 1-4, 1pm-4pm, \$400

Students will work on mid-elementary operation skills and memorization of multiplication facts with fun activities. Students will explore the geometry concepts of area, perimeter, volume, angles, and shapes. We will take the fear out of the concepts of telling time with an analog clock, money, fractions (EEK!) and decimals! We will also broach pre-Algebra concepts. After this seminar, your child will call themselves "mathy!"

Middle School ELA

While writing can be a difficult skill to learn, we at MAC will work with these middle school students to develop a 5-paragraph essay disguised as a travel brochure to a vacation spot of their choosing, even if they choose another planet or universe! We will address the following skills: following directions, developing a thesis, outlining a 5-paragraph essay that addresses the thesis, researching and including supporting details within each paragraph, proper MLA formatting and correctly citing sources. These brochures will be worthy of publication, and you will surely be impressed by their ability to research and draft an essay! Middle School Creative Writing

Middle School Math

High School Math

For students of all ages:

Orton-Gillingham Dyslexia Skills

One-on-One, \$120/hour; Small Group (2-3), \$80/hour

Offered throughout the summer, these new small group one-hour seminars beginning June 20, July 18 and August 15, provide an accelerated presentation of the dyslexia skills intervention classes we offer throughout the year one on one and in small groups. The groups will meet for one hour across 4 days each week.

Summer Work Support

3 Hour Seminars throughout the summer, M-Th, \$400/week

Offered throughout the summer, new small groups beginning mid-month, will help students stay on track with summer reading, writing and math assignments. Small seminar groups will keep the students more motivated and engaged than if they completed their summer work on their own at home, without your having to worry about monitoring their progress. Executive Functioning Skills
